Graduate students must obtain a certificate of completion for academic ethics education before applying for the thesis defense. Each department, institute, or degree program shall determine the qualification for this requirement. Graduate students who have completed the minimum duration of study, the required courses and credits, and a draft of their thesis may apply for the thesis defense. The application must be submitted at least 20 days before the scheduled thesis defense date and after completing registration and course selection for the semester. A passing grade for the thesis defense is 70 points. 	The thesis defense grade accounts for 50% of the final graduation grade. Graduate students may complete self-directed learning through the Taiwan Academic Ethics Education Resource Center website and obtain a certificate by passing the final assessment. For departments, institutes, or degree programs that require additional professional academic ethics education courses, students must comply with the specific regulations set by their respective departments, institutes, or programs. If a graduate student fails the thesis defense but has not yet reached the maximum duration of study, they may apply for a re-examination in the following academic year or semester. If they fail the re-examination, they will be dismissed. If the re-examination is passed, the grade will be recorded as 70 points.
